

2010 EDIS Symposium – Best Practice Sessions

Best Practice Sessions are designed to educate registrants about success stories at hospitals where a particular EDIS has been installed. The presenter should highlight their realized success in addressing a particular need. Preference will be given to those presenters who have successfully changed a process that was greatly enhanced by an EDIS feature or application. Ideally, these presenters should be able to demonstrate the value of the system or process with actual data.

Some examples would be:

1. Enhancing management of acute stroke patients by decreasing turnaround time in the ED, plus facilitating and documenting measures to comply with regulatory or certification requirements.

2. Applying the use of accurate data to:
 - a. facilitate movement of patients through the department
 - b. plan staffing changes either in real time or in the future
 - c. demonstrate to other department or hospital administrators that the service they provide needs improvement.

These Best Practice Sessions will be held in breakout rooms as a concurrent track with the general session lectures on Saturday, November 13, 2010. Sessions will ideally be interactive, allowing adequate time for questions, answers and discussion.

The presentations for Best Practice Sessions will be accepted at the discretion of the course planners. Scheduled times may not be known until shortly before the meeting. Each session is a total of one hour including any set up or tear down needed.

We invite exhibitors to propose a speaker and presentation. If accepted, exhibitors will be responsible for their presentation, a computer, software and the expenses of the presenter, including but not limited to travel, lodging and meal expenses as well as any honorarium for the presenter. PaACEP will provide the venue, the room, a screen, LCD Projector, podium, wired microphone (if needed) and AV support.
